



## St. Peters Academy of Dance Covid-19 Precautions/Guidelines

Dear Parents and Dancers,

We are so excited to be returning to dance class this fall. Our dance year is going to look a little different, but SPAD has and will continue to follow the mandates and guidelines provided by the State of Missouri to keep our dance family healthy.

**The following rules have been put in place to ensure that we keep our dancers and staff safe:**

- All dancers and staff will be required to wear masks in the building.
- No parents or siblings in the building unless your child is under the age of five.
- WATER BOTTLES ONLY. No food or drinks allowed.

**The following precautions will be taken to ensure each person entering the building is healthy:**

- Each dancer and staff member will have their temperature checked before entering the building.
- The use of hand sanitizer will be required at the beginning and end of class, as well as during if need be.
- Each dancer will be given a 6x6 square to use while in the studio as well as a barre spot that is 6ft apart from dancers on either side.

**The following entering/exiting procedure will be put into place starting the first day of classes:**

- Classes in Studios A/B will enter through the 2ND entrance.
- Classes in Studios C/D/E will enter through the main entrance.
- Parents will be asked to drop their dancer off at the door no more than 10 minutes before the class begins.
- If you need to pay tuition or have inquiries for the front desk, please wait till all dancers are in class and then you are welcome to come in.
- We ask that parent parking lot drop off maintains the semi-circle formation to keep traffic flowing.

SPAD has worked diligently to provide a safe environment for our dancers and staff. Before and after each class studio rooms will be sanitized. The studios, surfaces and restrooms will be sanitized before and after each dance day and frequently throughout times of operation.

We thank you for allowing your dancer to continue with their passion during this unprecedented time. This has been a challenging year for everyone, and we are incredibly grateful for our SPAD family.
